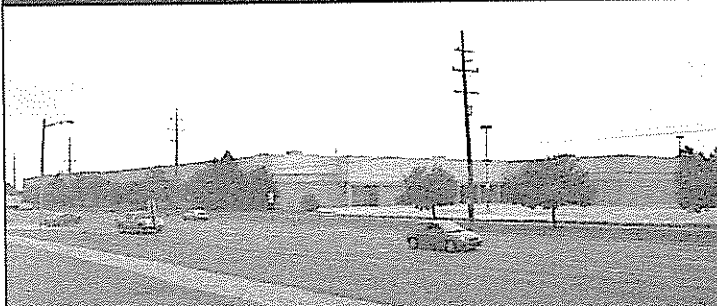

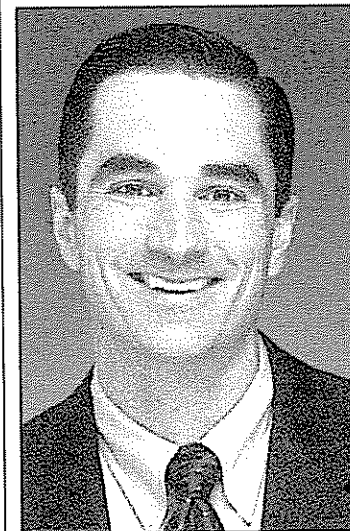

The executive director of the Ypsilanti-based Clean Energy Coalition, a nonprofit agency promoting clean energy technologies, has received a \$50,000 Biofuels Infrastructure Incentive Grant to provide incentives to Michigan gasoline station retailers to install or convert fueling equipment to ethanol or biodiesel. Reed says the grant, from the Michigan Department of Labor & Economic Growth, will give consumers greater access to clean-burning and renewable fuels by providing incentives up to \$3,000 per station to install new equipment.

The president and chief executive officer of Bloomfield Hills-based Pulte Homes Inc. watched his company's third quarter profits take a dive by 52 percent last week. Pulte is the nation's No. 2 homebuilder and is being hammered by the growing inventory of unsold homes across the U.S. coupled with falling prices. Pulte's net income dropped to \$190.2 million and 74 cents per share for the period. That's compared to \$395.4 million and \$1.50 per share for the same period a year ago.
